

The second part of the Gus MacAmlaigh Collection includes a wide range of rarities from every major bank, some of which haven't been seen on the market for decades.

This collection includes specimens of the Ploughman £50 and £100, neither of which have appeared in auction for decades. Additionally, a unique Lavery £50 of 1928 signed by Éamon de Valera is certain to garner some interest. The English section is extensive. There are exceptional groups of Treasury and Bank of England, including many wonderful condition first and last prefix varieties. Additionally, a 'Parchment Pair' with serial number 31 and beautiful 'Gold Note' are sure to excite some interest.

DNW are also proud to be offering the first part of Sir David Kirch's fascinating collection of 'Skit Notes'. This will be sold over the next few years and is sure to be both interesting and amusing in equal measure. The world banknotes portion of the sale leans heavily towards the Middle-east on this occasion. Highlights include an iconic Iraqi 100 Dinar of Faisal II, a Qatari 500 Riyals of the first issue in brilliant uncirculated condition, both from the Gemini Collection ...

There is also a lovely group of Palestine and Israel notes, the best of which is a £5 of 1944 with paper quality that has to be felt to be believed. The rest of the world is not ignored however, and the star lot of the auction is undoubtedly a Burma 100 Rupees of King George V with black overprint, an exceptionally rare variety in unparalleled condition.

Finally, Thomasina would not forgive me if I failed to mention the Spanish 1000 Pesetas of 1907, a true beauty and a triumph of banknote design.





Skit Notes

A Brief Explanation of Skit Notes

C kit notes have been appearing in auctions and dealers lists for decades, with few people entirely sure $oldsymbol{\mathcal{O}}$ how to list or categorise them. These documents, for it is technically incorrect to call them banknotes, are remarkable pieces of social history. They give us snapshots into the cares, fears, livelihoods, humour and pastimes of those who lived and worked in the British Isles for the last several hundred years

Skit notes generally mirror designs of real banknotes of the era, from early Hase £1 notes to Treasury 10 Shillings to Somerset £10 notes. Some, by accident or design, sail very close to the wind, and 19th century court records are full of attempts made by unscrupulous or ignorant individuals to pass them as real money. Many of the punishments were severe.


Some of these notes tie in with what we know about the grand story of kings and wars and politics they warn of imminent French invasion or protest for better working and living conditions. Others are outwardly much more pedestrian, advertising the services of a small wine merchant, or a Christmas pantomime. Still others were never anything more than jokes or amusing gifts for friends or lovers, and are all the more charming for that.

Researching skit notes would have been difficult, if not impossible in the days before the internet. Astonishing connections can now be made between the individuals and addresses named on the notes using all sorts of sources such as newspaper articles, court records, maps and ancestry websites. This means that at last, it is possible to tell the hidden stories of these remarkable pieces of paper.

This is merely the first part of the astonishing collection put together by Sir David Kirch - more will appear in future auctions. I hope that you all enjoy reading about the notes as much as I have enjoyed researching them, and that they find good homes in your own collections.

Nonsense or Joke Notes



Bank of Folly, an April Fool note, denominated in a single Fool (i.e. the receiver of the note!), at the Temple of Folly, 1 April 1947, serial number A/F 71841, signature of 'Wide Awake', with an amusing vignette of a man waggling his fingers with his thumb on his nose, decent quality printing on very thin paper, clean and fresh, a few folds in upper and lower margins good very fine and rare

42 Fleet Bank in England, 25 Pence, 21 June 1811, serial number 64781, signature of R. Denton, some toning and small stains but a nice looking example, very fine and very scarce

Richard Denton was an engraver who appears to have produced these 'Fleet Bank' notes from his cell in Fleet Prison! When a copper printing plate was discovered in his possession he was sentenced to six more months for the offence. He claimed he was doing it to make 'a few pence for his family while confined'.

This is a very passable imitation of a Bank of England note, the 'Fleet' part of the title being printed in tiny lettering, and the vignette incredibly similar to that on genuine examples. There are numerous contemporary court cases where people (innocently or otherwise) were imprisoned or even transported for uttering (paying with) these notes.



43 Little Sheffield Bank, for Presto, Adagio, Moderato & Concertante, 5 Halfpence, 1797, no signature or serial number, fine and very rare

This is one of the few 'skit notes' that appears to be almost entirely devoid of meaning. It could be a joke which we no longer have the context to understand, or it could be some kind of printing test or sample. In any case, it is one of the earliest 'skit notes' known.

This note probably refers in some way to the Zulu War which began in 1879. It seems likely was produced by a liberal individual or group who were morally opposed to the war. It is unclear whether the vignette refers to the innocence of the Zulu, or the supposed celibate military system, or something else entirely.

It is not possible to say for sure but Sir Charles Spencer may refer to Lord Charles Spencer, the MP for Oxfordshire, but it is unclear what the vignette is attempting to portray, or why.



Brotherly Love Bank, for the Three Grand Principles, a Masonic note promising to pay Brother Secrecy the sum of 1 Shilling, Newcastle, 7 April 1806, serial number A48, manuscript signature of Faithful Hope, with Masonic symbols engraved at left, with a small but beautifully executed hand coloured element, minor mounting remnants on reverse low left corner slightly damaged, overall very fine and rare

Given the issue location, it seems likely that the serial number is A48 because the oldest Masonic lodge in the 'Province of Durham' is in Gateshead and is lodge number 48. There are other such Masonic notes known, with several different 'branches' and payees known to have been printed. The purpose or use of the notes is unclear.

50 Brett's, 109, Drury Lane, a note promising to 'supply the bearer with pure Patent Brandy, Patent Holland's and every other genuine article in the Wine and Spirit Trade at fair and reasonable prices or forfeit £1000', 1 December 1832, signature of Henry Brett, previously mounted and remains of blue paper still attached to reverse, low right corner top missing, overall fine and scarce

Henry Brett was born in 1787 in Holborn. He established his business in 1929 and can be seen advertising in various newspapers by 1832. In 1851 he is described in the Census as a Brandy Merchant and Hotel Keeper at 138-140 Holborn Hill. 
Benjamin Margrave (b.1742) lived in Gainsborough and appears to have been involved in several businesses there. For example, there are records of him selling a public house named the Boars Head in 1806. He died in 1818 (a year after this note was produced), after an illness of ten years which left him bedbound.

Trent Falls is the name given to the confluence of the Rivers Ouse and Trent, close to Hull in Yorkshire. The Albion was one of at least three steam packets (others being named Cobourg and British Queen), in which Benjamin Margrave held shares. These ships traded between Hull and Gainsborough, which helps explain the title and theme of this note. The purpose of this note isn't quite clear, but it seems likely that it is simply to advertise the services of his Steam Packet.



Bank of Experience, £5, 10 February 1839, serial number 55, signature of Leukin Jones, the note promises to 'pay on demand for the Governor of the World the sum of five pounds to any person who can find a better paper than the Paul Pry or, a greater fool than the bearer of this note', very good and rare **Outing unlisted**

This note was very likely produced in the United States, and was intended to advertise the New York satirical newspaper entitled Paul Pry. The name Paul Pry was a well known joke in the 19th century and would have been understood by all, and simply meant a nosy or enquiring person. There were numerous plays, newspapers and even a few pubs of this name, but the cataloguer can only find one newspaper that fits with the date on the note.



Mendham's Tea Warehouse, Ipswich, a note promising to pay the bearer 5 Shillings on demand, hand dated 1803, no serial number or signature, vignette of a tea chest at top left, complete with with naive depiction's of Chinese characters, wonderful condition, good very fine and extremely rare Outing unlisted £240-£300


William Mendham was born in 1770 in Ipswich. In September 1792 he opened a new grocery and tea warehouse in Bank Buildings, Ipswich. He was quite successful and operated the business for several decades, and married Hannah Baker in 1793 and died in August 1838. The wording on this note is extremely interesting, unequivocally promising to pay the bearer 5 shillings. It is possible it was a real voucher of some kind. Ex. Godfrey Burr Collection, 2007



Manchester & Gibralter Bank, for the Governor of the Gibralter Hotel, Pall Mall, a note promising to pay the bearer 2 Pence for winnings at Bagatelle, Manchester, 17 January 1810, serial number 1639, signed by William Murray, with a very nicely printed and ornate vignette of a contemporary steam train in a crowned frame at top left, partially stuck on card, very good, extremely rare and a wonderful item


Bagatelle was a very popular 19th century precursor to Bar Billiards, and this note may actually be serious in promising to pay the bearer two pence for winning at it. The reasons for the naming of the note, and the subject matter of the vignette are unclear, but there was once a Gibralter Street in Manchester, and it was right next to the new Victoria Railway station in 1840. There may have been a Hotel on or near the street. Alternatively, it is possible that the Gibralter Hotel may have been on Pall Mall in London, and the 'winner' of the note might have had to catch the train to Manchester to cash in his almighty prize of 2 pence. Alternatively, and most likely, the note is simply nonsense, or was some kind of in-joke that we now lack the context to understand.



55 Gillbank and Co, Spirit Establishment, a note promising to supply the bearer with any quantity of Old & Genuine Wines or Spirits from a Stock of Ten Thousand Pounds, 19 December 1933, serial number 21, printed signature of Gillbank, vignette of a cherub with a wine glass seated on a barrel at top left, very thin paper, making the condition even more remarkable, good very fine and very scarce Outing 4050a

The Gillbank family appear to have owned the wine merchants for around two decades, prior to its sale in 1848. At this time the premises at 21 Pickett Street, just off The Strand, opposite St Clements Church (which still stands), was also a public house named the Kings Head. The Warehouse continued to function in the same capacity under new ownership.





Bank of Elegant Engraving, a beautiful note denominated £100 advertising the services of H.H.Collins & Co., October 1854, signature of H.H.Collins, with a wonderful reverse depicting the Crystal Palace and and underprint describing the note as a 'Bank Note of the Crystal Palace', clearly attempting to cash in on the Great Exhibition of 1851, original good very fine, rare and a very attractive and well produced note **Outing unlisted** £200-£260

Henry Haley Collins was an engraver who appears to have had an interesting and well travelled life. Born in 1818 in London, he lived all over southern and western England. When this note was produced he was running a successful business with two apprentices from Great Winchester Street in London. He died in the Hospital for Incurables in Putney in 1890, with an estate worth the fairly paltry sum of £101.



57 Bank of Engraving, a passable imitation of a Bank of England £20, promising to 'pay all bets or forfeit the sum of twenty pounds', 23 June 1905, serial number 51856, signature of J.J.Morris, minor graffiti, fine and rare





Hairdressers and Barbers of this era often operated as informal agents for servants and employers, hence the text on this note 'Register Office for Servants'.



59 Norfolk, Suffolk & Essex, Banks of Elegance, a note denominated £5,000 advertising the hairdressing services of the Faiers family, ND (c.1840's-50's), serial number 12, signature of H.H.Faiers, minor foxing but good fine to about very fine, rare Outing unlisted £200-£260

The Faiers brothers, Samuel, Henry and John, operated at least four hairdressing establishments in the 1840's through to the 1870's, though John filed for bankruptcy in 1843 and is not listed on this note. They had branches in Norwich, Ipswich, Colchester and in London. All had wives and other family members assisting in the business. This note also advertises the sale of Jewellery, Cutlery, Shell Combs and Hairbrushes. The note was printed in Norwich by a local printer, Dallinger, to a good standard.



Bank of Elegance, 36 Lowgate, Hull, a note promising to 'supply on demand to my friends and the public, Boots and Shoes of the best Quality, at such prices that must give satisfaction, or forfeit the sum of Five Pounds', 7 October 1869, serial number 4, signature of Robert Garton, foxed, with minor edge damage, mounting remnants on reverse, good fine and very scarce

Outing unlisted £150-£200

Robert Garton, born in 1814, was a successful Yorkshire businessman who appears in records throughout the 19th Century, mostly in Hull. He had various businesses and premises, including one opposite the Hull branch of the Bank of England on Whitefriargate. Despite declaring himself bankrupt twice, in 1850 and 1864, he recovered and left a considerable amount of money when he died in 1898.

The Royal Surrey was a large and successful Theatre on Blackfriars Road in Southwark. It was burned and rebuilt several times, and eventually closed in 1901. The site is now residential flats. George Conquest, born in 1837 was a long standing and hugely successful actor. He ran the Surrey Theatre from 1881 until his death in 1901. He had three sons, the first of which was called George, and is almost certainly the man referred to on this note since he was playing Aladdin at the Surrey Theatre in January 1885.


Tom Major, Property Master may refer to Thomas Major, born in 1841 in Hull. in 1881 he was living at 246 Westminster Road, Lambeth, working as a music hall vocalist.

Rigdum Funnidos was the pen name of George Cruikshank, the famous caricaturist. This note, signed by the fictitious Rigdum Funibus, is probably a play on that name. This note is almost identical in design to the previous lot, but of vastly inferior print quality, suggesting that it was copied and adjusted.





65 Bank of Merriment, Royal Grecian, a note denominated in FUN, advertising the seasonal pantomime at the Royal Grecian Theatre, 11 January 1854, serial number 1854, issued by B.O.Conquest, City Road, and with full details and billing on reverse, complete with wonderful vignettes of some of the players, (including a Mr. C. Webb), small repaired tear, overall good fine and an exceptional piece, very scarce

Benjamin Oliver Conquest, born in 1803, was a very successful theatre manager, overseeing over 50 pantomimes at the Garrick and Grecian theatres over the course of his

The Morning Advertiser of 3 January 1854 lists performances commencing with a new drama, The Life of an Actress, and concluded with the new pantomime Harlequin Charity Brat, or, The Magic Christmas Piece.

This note combines elements of design from Bank of England notes of the day with a highly amusing spoof of the Bank of Ireland notes of the period, replacing the medusa heads with various harlequin faces.



Gilbert + Watson Ltd, a spoof but rather realistic 10 Shilling note advertising the show Miss Paris-in-London, 4 January 1915, very fine and scarce

Miss Paris in London was an 'original aqua musicale', using 50,000 gallons of water, that debuted in London and Castleford in November 1914. Treasury notes had been in circulation for less than six months at the time this note was created, so there is no doubt that it would have caught the eye of the many people unfamiliar with them.





Flora Cromer, a spoof £1 advertising 'her latest success, The Kaiser's Gramaphone', ND (c.1914-15), signature of 'some girl' and a likeness of Flora Comer at left in the place of King George V, very fine and very scarce £100-£150

Flora Cromer was amongst the biggest stars in London's at the outbreak of the first world war. She was a singer, songwriter, mimic, comedian and pantomime artiste. She specialised in musical monologues such as the Kaisers Gramophone, advertised here. She continued performing it until at least 1919. Recordings of her performances survive, and are well worth a

Described as 'A Novel Drama of Great Heart and Hebrew Interest', Petticoat to Park Lane was performed shortly after the outbreak of war at the Palace Theatre in Batterse.

United Kingdom of Great Blessings and Joyland, an entirely hand painted Christmas and New Year card in the likeness of a Treasury £1, dated Christmas 1924, serial number 1925, signature of the artist, Alexine Thorpe, with imagery including a turkey, sausages and a Christmas pudding on the obverse and Father Christmas in a wheeled sled powered, seemingly, by Shell Motor Spirit, on reverse, truly beautiful and a very touching item, very fine and unique

Alexine Thorpe (born Alexine Sara Tinne Berthon, born 1865) is listed in the 1911 census as a miniature painter and retired concert singer in Selsey, near Chichester, and was clearly an artist of some skill. This meticulously crafted and well imagined Christmas note is both charming and brilliantly executed. She died in 1935.

Alexine came from a remarkable family, with her sister, Ellen Margaret Tinne Berthon M.B. (London), being amongst the first women to gain a full medical degree at the Royal Free University in London. She became an assistant physician in Clapham Maternity Hospital at a time when this was unheard of for a woman.

Bank Restriction Bill 'Anti-Hanging note', 1819, a satirical note designed by George Cruickshank, signed by J.
